CAMPSITE POLICIES

Camping opportunities are available for currently enrolled students only (not the general public) on weekends at designated campsites. The campsites are "primitive" in design, thus electricity and running water are not available at the campsites. Please follow the rules outlined below.

- Campsite Reservations All campsites must be reserved in advance and registration takes place at Reinhardt Central. Only use the designated campsites on the designated day.
- Campsites Days/Hours The campsites can only be reserved for weekend camping (i.e. Friday and Saturday nights, Friday 4 p.m. thru Sunday 2 p.m.). Given the unique terrain and landscape of the trails and campsite, campers must be at their campsite prior to sunset and campers may not leave the campsite areas after sunset unless in case of an emergency.
- Site Responsibility The person reserving the campsite is responsible for guests and campsite activities.
- Number of People/Tents per Site Only those students who have registered for the campsite with Reinhardt Central are allowed on the campgrounds. Six people is the maximum number allowed at a campsite. Each site may have two small tents or one large tent.
- Quiet Hours Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Campsite Inspections Campsites will be inspected when you leave. The Site Supervisor may conduct random site checks during the evening and morning hours.
- Leave No Trace Please do not litter or engage in any activity that damages the camp site or the surrounding area. Please respect and protect all of Reinhardt's wildlife and historical, archeological and research sites. No objects may be removed or damaged.
- Trash Campers must clean their campsite as they leave the campsite. All trash must be removed from
 the site and placed in a trash dumpster either behind the Athletic Center or behind East/West Apartments.
- Tents All tents must be pitched on the pad, where provided.
- Campfires Campfires are permitted only in the fire ring provided at the campsite. Campfires must be small and contained in the fire ring (no large bon fires allowed). Campfires must be attended at all times and extinguished before going to sleep and before leaving the site.
- Firewood If you do not bring your own firewood, collect only dead wood that is on the ground. Do not
 cut branches off of live trees.
- Going to the Bathroom in the Woods As the campsites are intended to offer a primitive camping experience, there are no bathrooms and no outhouses. Deposit solid human waste in catholes dug 6 to 8 inches deep at least 200 feet from water, camp, and trails. Cover and disguise the cathole when finished. Pack out toilet paper and hygiene products.
- Vehicles Vehicles must be left in the gravel parking lot near the trail kiosk. You may not drive to the campsites to drop off and pick up supplies. No vehicle camping or camping trailers are permitted.
- Pets No pets are allowed on the campsites.
- Swimming/Boating No swimming and/or boating is permitted in the lake.
- Emergency contact In case of an emergency call Reinhardt Public Safety 770-720-5911 or 911. Emergency blue-light phones are located in the parking lot of the Athletic Center. Campers are also encouraged to have a cell phone for access to emergency resources.
